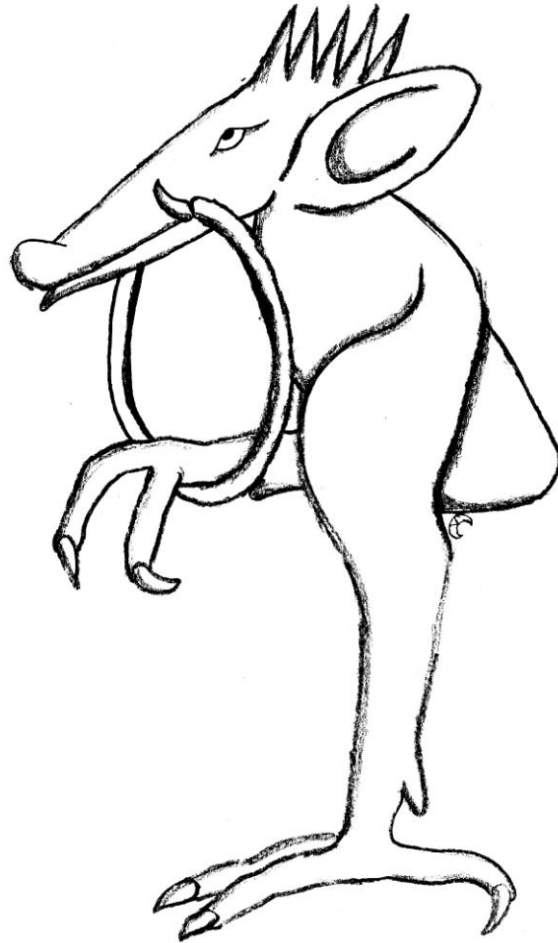

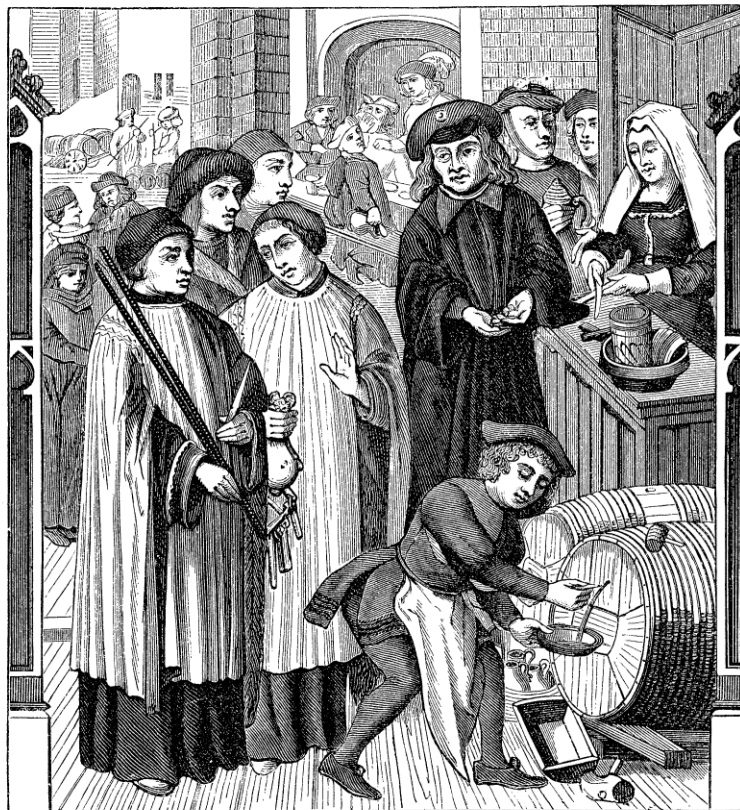

Greetings from your Seneschal!

Greetings to the people of the Debatable Lands and friends, from Hilda Hugelmann!

I was recently confirmed as the new Seneschale of our fair Barony. Thank you so much to THL Fredeburg for her years of service! Also, welcome to Lady Ailleán ingen Proinnsias, our new MOL, and thanks to Sir Alonzio, our outgoing MOL, for his years of service!

As the new Seneschale of the Debatable Lands, I want to say hello and invite each one of you to seek me out (email/phone/in person) and tell me what you think. How do you think the Barony is doing? What have we been doing right? What could we be doing better? The job of the Seneschale is to make sure the business end of the SCA is running smoothly. But my personal goal is to help make sure each one of you is having fun! This wonderful, unique, precious hobby of ours is, at its core, all about us having fun. I will do what I can to make that happen, and I look forward to hearing from you.

To introduce myself more fully to those who don't know me: Previously, I had served four years as Baronial Exchequer, three years as Silver Buckle Exchequer, and also six months as Seneschale of Cour d'Or. 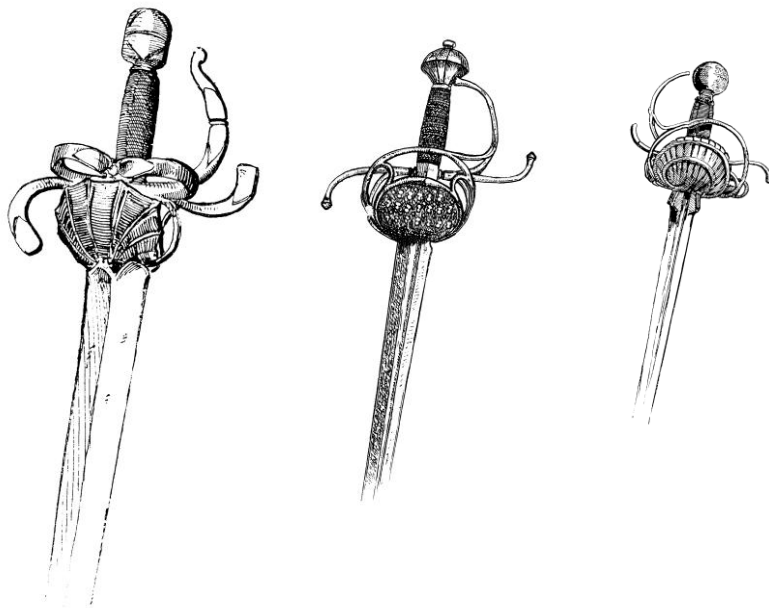
Regarding Rapier Fighting:

Regional Archery Practice

This is the day after Aethelmearc Coronation. We will begin at 10:00 in the morning and continue until 5:00 that afternoon.

The primary goal at this practice will allow everyone who wishes to shoot for the Gwyntarian Winter Challenge which closes soon after this date. Last year we had 44 archers from our Kingdom and 14 from the immediate area alone. We would like to conduct this as our morning project and leave the afternoon for everything else.

We will have novelty targets and anything that we can think of that is safe to shoot at.

Space permitting and pending marshal availability, there may be some individual training.

Of course, we will have archery from the Castle parapets.

Further, if I can convince *certain archers*, I'm sure we will have interesting and bizarre targets to shoot at.

The Barony-Marche loaner gear will be available.

Food will be pot luck. Brings hot and cold meals, side dishes, desserts, and snacks as you wish. Try out something new – archers are hardy souls. Soft drinks will be provided.

I attended court for over an hour, while my kids happily pursued other activities (huzzah to youth activities coordinator, and the gaming table people especially. My son played games all day.) All my kids came home raving about how much fun they had! Thank you thank you thank you to all!”

Greetings from Cour d'Or

The College of Cour d'Or is a subgroup of the Barony Marche of the Debatable Lands. The people of the College are any who consider themselves a part, including past and present students, staff, and faculty of the local universities. Sadly, due to inactivity, we are allowing Cour d'Or to go dormant.

The College is no longer the self-sustaining, independent group it was in the past. Many people consider themselves part Cour d'Or, but very few organize Cour d'Or oriented activities. In the six years that I've been involved with the college (first as Chatelaine and presently as Seneschale), we have worked towards growing the Barony from the College. Consequently, these days a Scadian in the Pittsburgh area is more likely to identify with the Barony than the College. There remain a handful of current students who are active in the different areas of the SCA, but none that are able to step up and organize. Additionally, the College has not hosted an event in years.

We have made every effort to sustain the College as an independent group, but we have been unsuccessful. Each fall we hold a demo at Pitt and at CMU; while there is always a lot of interest in the SCA, we get only a few who will come to our activities. I tried to engage them in a "what do you like to do, what would you like to see" session, and then they get busy with school, as students do. I have made it possible for them to go to the various practices/meetings by giving and arranging rides weekly for years. We have tried movie nights, we have tried fliers, and we have tried emailing them. Despite these and other efforts, our numbers have stagnated, and we are currently inactive.

Because Cour d'Or is a College, we do not have to disband it for lack of activity, but can instead allow it to go dormant. Quoting from the SCA, Inc. Corpora (2001 ed., rev. 2006) III. (Branches) C. (Branch Designations) 6, last bullet point in full:

“A special type of local branch is available for use at schools or military bases, or in other situations where membership is likely to fluctuate for reasons beyond the members’ control. The “territory” of such branches is defined in terms of affiliation with the institution where they are based, not in terms of physical boundaries. Institutional branches may report directly to a kingdom, but if their institution is located within the borders of a branch of any other class, they report through that branch. They differ from other local branches in that they go dormant if membership falls below five (5), rather than being disbanded.”

During February’s Officers’ Meeting, I proposed to the Officers of the Barony that we allow the College to go dormant and create a College Liaison position whose responsibility will be to maintain group status at the colleges and to organize the college demos, with the option to work with the Baronial Chatelaine on college newcomer events. The Officers agreed to these proposals. I will fill the College Liaison position until another person materializes or the College of Cour d'Or reforms.

I understand that many who read this may be surprised or saddened, and many will have questions. Please understand that we will welcome the College coming out of dormancy when a self-reliant, interested, active group of students appears. Also, please do not think that by doing this we are neglecting the student population, nor will our ability to use the universities’ facilities be in jeopardy. We will not lose any of our privileges as campus entities by going dormant.

If anyone has questions or wants to discuss further they can contact me or THL Hilderun Hügelmann, our Baronial Seneschale, directly. I want to thank everyone who has helped me try to keep the College together and the Officers of the Barony for their support in this decision.
