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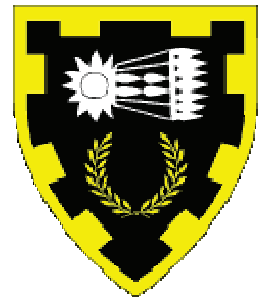

Greetings on this Chill Winter Day. I wish all of you the very best health and happiness this most festive time of year.

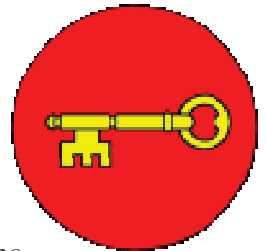

An Announcement from the Board of Directors

The Board of Directors of the Society for Creative Anachronism, Inc. would collectively like to thank everyone who took the time to write to us regarding the proposed changes to Corpora that would provide Crowns the option to allow same-sex couples to compete in Crown/Coronet Lists. This topic is clearly one that people feel very strongly about, as the opportunity to fight or be fought for in the Lists is at the heart of our Society.

To gain a more quantitative understanding of the issue the Board tasked the 2010 SCA Census Committee with surveying the populace on this topic. The SCA census results were divided almost evenly between those that did not want such changes, those that did want such changes, and those that had not given an opinion either way. As further background to the issue, one Kingdom had formally requested a variance to Corpora for a specific Coronet List, and the Board is of course aware of the broader social and political trends wherein the topic of same-sex marriage has not only been on ballots in multiple US states in recent years, but has also been addressed as a human rights issue in several non-US countries. The Board felt that requesting additional commentary would provide a deeper set of information from the membership, such as specific concerns people had, alternate wording options, and a better sense of what this proposed change or the retention of the current restriction would mean to people in our organization.

The individual members of the Board come from varied backgrounds and experiences within the SCA – so as to provide broad representation at that level of the organization. Directors are fundamentally just seven members of our Society, each with our own strongly held opinions on this topic (and many others), just like every other member of our Society – though we are tasked with an obligation to make decisions in the best interest of the organization as a whole. The topic of same-sex consorts, and the implications and needs of both today's and tomorrow's Society have been discussed in-depth at every quarterly meeting and many conference calls in the last months. As with any potential change to Corpora, changes only happen after the opinions of the membership have been requested and fully reviewed, and the change is approved by a majority (at least 5 out of 7) vote of the Board.

Two variants of proposed wording changes to provide the option to Crowns to allow same-sex couples to compete in Crown/Coronet Lists were sent out to the membership for commentary, the second commentary period ending Dec. 1, 2012. An additional proposed change to restrict each member of an entering couple to be either fighter or consort is still out for commentary until March 1st, 2013.

At the Dec 4th, 2012 conference call, the following Board action was taken:

Motion by Tim Jennings to approve the following change to Corpora IV.B.1, effective immediately:

Each competitor in a Royal List must be fighting for a prospective consort of the opposite sex unless the Crown has elected to permit a competitor to fight for a prospective consort of the same sex.

Seconded by Lisa May. In favor: Mark Faulcon, John Fulton, Denise Hundley, Tim Jennings, Lisa May, Max Nelson. Opposed: None. Chairman Leslie Vaughn exercised her option to vote and did so in favor of the motion. Motion carried.

Crowns now have the ability to accept entrance into their Lists by any and all pairs acceptable to the Crown. As the saying goes, “With great power comes great responsibility.” With this change, the Board places its trust in the Crowns, both current and future, to use this tool in a manner that best meets not only the wants and the needs of Their kingdoms and populace, but the Society as a whole.

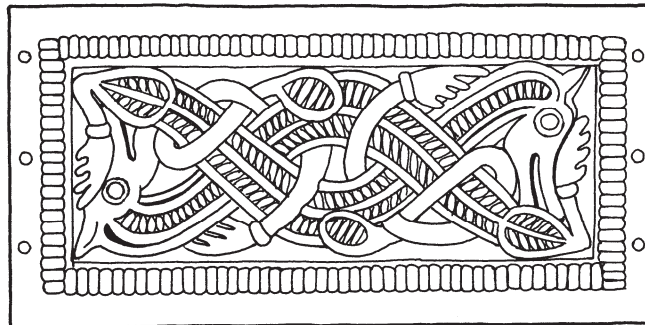

Greetings from the Captain of Archers!

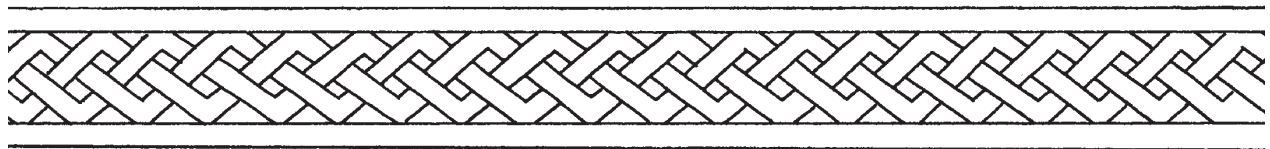

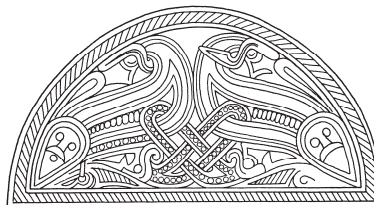
Dearest Barony,

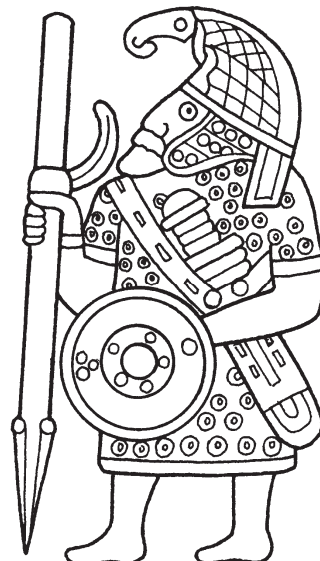
We'll have loaner gear for any new fighters who need it. Make sure to bring a water bottle.

The Recipe Corner

Country Sausage from the Cooks' Guild by Elss of Augsburg

If you were fortunate enough to have a seat for the 2012 Agincourt Feast in the Debatable Lands, you enjoyed some wonderful food prepared by THLady Odriana vander Brugghe and her staff. There was an addition to the menu, however, of some spicy country sausage patties that were made by the participants at the Cooks' Guild meeting in October.

The original recipe was developed from period sources by Getty Museum gallery teachers Nancy Real and Robin Trento, who planned a culinary workshop to complement the 2011 exhibition [Imagining the Past in France, 1250–1500](http://blogs.getty.edu/iris/Imagining-the-culinary-past-in-france-recipes-for-a-medieval-feast/). THLady Michelina Cenomani da Trento, who runs the Guild and who did the shopping, adapted the ingredients freely to accommodate budgetary and availability considerations. For example, she bought ground beef instead of veal, and we added red wine instead of white because that was what we had on hand. We also wanted a recipe that could be easily duplicated in any modern kitchen. Thus we used ground meats instead of carving and grinding a pork shoulder or veal shank ourselves. All of us at the Guild meeting that day thought these were delicious, and so did the lucky feasters at Agincourt!

French Country Sausage (*Saucisse a Cuire*)

Original recipe by Robin Trento; modifications by the BMDL Cooks' Guild

1 pound ground pork
1 pound ground beef
½ pound sliced bacon, finely diced
½ tablespoon each freshly ground pepper and salt
1 teaspoon each of thyme, sage, marjoram, parsley
1 teaspoon each of nutmeg, cinnamon, cloves, all ground
¼ cup dry red wine
2 to 4 tablespoons flour
vegetable oil, as needed

1. Mix together the ground pork, the ground beef, and the bacon.
2. Mix in the salt and pepper, herbs, and spices; then pour in the wine. Blend well with fingers. Allow the mixture to rest overnight or for a couple of hours in a tightly covered bowl in the refrigerator so all flavors can mingle.
3. With moistened hands, shape the sausage mixture into round patties about ¾" thick and 2" wide. Lightly dust both sides of the patties with flour prior to frying. Place them in a lightly greased pan set over medium heat. As they cook, gently press the patties with a slotted spatula to squeeze out excess fat. Brown patties 5 to 8 minutes on each side, then drain on paper towels and serve hot.

Makes 20 sausage patties

Pork Pie (recipe by Simon Rimmer from loveofherbs.co.uk, conversion from metric by Pavel)

Ingredients:

Pastry:

3–1/4 cups flour
3 tablespoons milk
3 tablespoons water
1/3 lb lard
yolk of 1 egg

Filling:

1lb cubed pork shoulder
1/3 lb smoked bacon
1 tablespoons each finely chopped sage and rosemary
Pinch nutmeg and allspice
Splash of Worcester Sauce
Salt and White Pepper

Making The Pie:

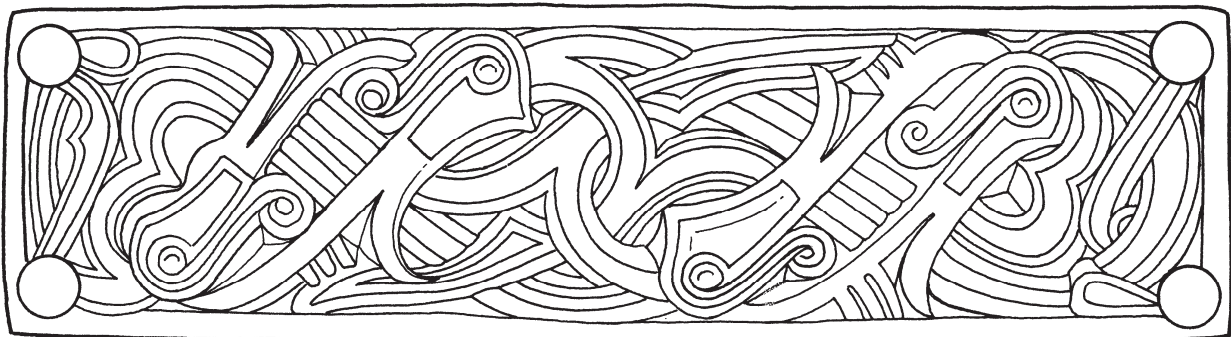
For the filling: Chop finely (or pulse in mixer) half the pork and bacon until ‘minced’. Combine with the rest of the pork, bacon and spices. Season well.

For the Pastry: Sift flour into a bowl. Warm the milk, lard, and water in a pan until the lard melts. Add to dry ingredients and mix well. Press out two-thirds of the pastry on a floured board, making it as thin as you can.

Place the rounded ball of the filling mix in the center and carefully ‘raise’ the pastry up around the sides of the filling. Flatten the remaining piece of pastry and place on the top of the pie, sealing the edges with beaten egg yolk. Brush pie with beaten egg yolk to glaze.

Cook at 350° F for about 45 minutes.

Directions from the west, northwest/southwest:

Go via PA Route 79 to Exit 68/Mt Nebo Road. At the end of the exit ramp, turn east onto the Yellow Belt. (The route is marked by signs with a Yellow Circle, and you will follow the Yellow Belt to North Park for 7.8 miles total.) After leaving Route 79, at the second traffic light, turn left onto Ardent Road. At the top of the hill, turn left. (Road changes names; follow the Yellow Belt signs). Ingomar Road leads to North Park. At the light at Ingomar Road and Babcock Boulevard, turn left. Take the first left turn at the T intersection onto Pearce Mill Road. The Rose Barn is the first building on the right. There will be signs.

Directions from the east, northeast/southeast:

Make your best way to PA Route 8. On the turnpike, take Exit 39, Butler Valley, then go south 1.3 miles on Route 8. If you use Route 28, take the Route 8 North exit, and go north. At Route 8 and Wildwood Road/Wildwood Road Ext, turn west onto Wildwood Road/Yellow Belt. (Road changes names; follow Yellow Belt signs). After 2.8 miles, at Ingomar Road and Babcock Boulevard, turn right. Make the first left onto Pearce Mill Road. The Rose Barn is the first building on the right. There will be signs.

DIRECTIONS from the Beaver Valley:

1. Take the Beaver Valley Expressway/ I-376 East to Exit #50 – Business 376 Moon.
2. Proceed on Business 376 Moon to the Thorn Run Exit.
3. Follow the exit ramp to STOP sign, turn LEFT onto Coraopolis Heights Road.
4. Continue on Coraopolis Heights Road through the next STOP sign and the traffic light.
5. Hyeholde's entrance gates are approximately 200 yards past the traffic light on the LEFT.

DIRECTIONS from the North Hills and Sewickley:

1. Cross the Sewickley Bridge and turn LEFT.
2. Make the first RIGHT (uphill) onto Thorn Run Road.
3. Proceed up the hill about 2 miles to a traffic light and turn LEFT onto Beaver Grade Road.
4. Proceed to the next traffic light and turn LEFT onto Coraopolis Heights Road.
5. Hyeholde's entrance gates are approximately 200 yards past the traffic light on the LEFT.

DIRECTIONS from Pittsburgh:

1. From the Fort Pitt Tunnel take I-376 West 11 miles to Business 376 Moon, Exit #57.
2. Take the Thorn Run Road ramp, keeping RIGHT to take the ramp toward the Air Force Reserve Base, to the STOP sign and turn LEFT onto Coraopolis Heights Road.
3. Continue on Coraopolis Heights Road through the traffic light.
4. Hyeholde's entrance gates are approximately 200 yards past the traffic light on the LEFT.

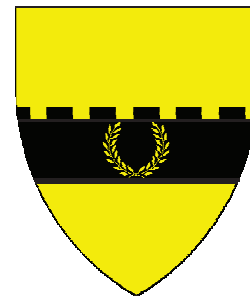
